

THE COMMODITY SUPPLEMENTAL FOOD PROGRAM

The Commodity Supplemental Food Programs (CSFP) is a federally funded program, which works to improve the health of elderly people at least 60 years of age by supplementing their diets with nutritious USDA commodity foods.

Each box contains 30- 40 pounds of food to supplement an older adult’s monthly diet, including: grains, vegetables, fruit, high protein items, juice, shelf-stable milk, and a block of cheese.



HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

Eligible seniors who meet the age, residential, and income guidelines will take part in certification interviews by distribution sites. Certified individuals will be informed of monthly distribution dates, times and location(s).

Eligibility Guidelines:

Eligible individuals must:

- meet the stated income guidelines
- be at least 60 years of age
- be a resident of Lake or Porter County

“The following percentages and dollar amounts of the total costs which will be financed with federal money: TEFAP (30%, \$3,160,483), CSFP (1%, \$46,486), and SFSP/TANF (1%, \$102,941) . The percentage and dollar amount of the total costs of the project or program that will be financed by nongovernmental sources is 68%, \$7,229,811.”

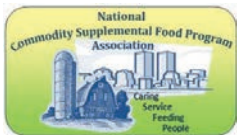
MISSION
