"My husband and I are raising two grandsons on a very limited income. With grocery prices going up even more since coronavirus, we just can't seem to make ends meet."

"First I got furloughed. That turned into being laid off, period. Finding a job that pays a wage we can live on, especially since unemployment benefits expired, is almost impossible.

"I'm still recovering from a major health setback. It'll be a while before I'm all the way back on my own two feet. I came here because I couldn't afford groceries this week."

Hunger often comes on the heels of not one hardship, but troubles piling up one after another. Too many people live one unexpected bill away **from becoming food insecure.** For many showing up at Food Bank partners this season, COVID-19 has been the straw breaking the camel's back.

in October alone. That's enough to provide well over a million nourishing meals to our Region's neighbors in need.

Some of that food will reach **Brothers' Keeper in Gary.** This men's shelter operates a pantry and soup kitchen open to food-insecure women, children, and families. Their motto is to "restore hope and dignity," a mission you help make possible.

Donating this month can also help the Food Bank expand its **Mobile Marketplace** distributions. These weekly deliveries reach people around East Chicago, Valparaiso, Hobart, Portage, Highland, and other rural communities. Thousands of Lake and Porter County families benefit monthly, with each receiving up to 50 pounds of nutritious fresh meats, dairy, and groceries to prepare nourishing meals and bridge the hunger gap.

Other providers counting on your help this season include Hebron Country Pantry, God's Appointed Place Church Food Pantry in Crown Point, First Baptist Church in Lake Station, and Catholic Charities in East Chicago.

In this season when the harvest is plentiful, let us remember so many people whose cupboards are bare. Only together can we continue to heal the hurt of hunger. •

Childhood Hunger Hurts.

This month, will you carve out a special gift to help the Food Bank reach every one of the estimated 30,000 kids across NWI who remain at risk for hunger? About 10% of these children live in East Chicago alone! There, the poverty rate is more than double the statewide average with more than one-third of residents living below the poverty line.

Research shows an association between food insecurity in young children and delayed development, risk of chronic illnesses, anxiety, and behavioral problems.

Remember, every \$1 gift to the Food Bank of Northwest Indiana can serve a nourishing meal to three neighbors in need. A number of our pantry partners offer fresh, seasonal produce. Don't forget that pumpkins are great for more than just decorating your front porch. Use them to prepare nutritious breads, pies, and seeds that pack a powerful nutritional punch.

Thank you. Because of you, the Food Bank has been able to overcome extraordinary challenges to ensure that no neighbor in need of nourishment in our Region goes without.

An untold number of first-time pantry visitors might have overwhelmed our resources. But good friends like you would not let that happen. Throughout the summer and early fall, you empowered our need to expand the days and ways we were able to get food to where it was needed most. The Food Bank has forged new partnerships, added staff and delivery vehicles, and put many new measures in place to ensure that employees, food, and clients are kept safe.

But now is no time to rest.

Feeding America now projects hunger will rise across Lake and Porter Counties by 37%–47% in 2020 compared with 2018. That will put the number of food-insecure kids and adults living across Northwest Indiana at well over 100,000. Heartbreaking.

During the coming season of plenty, we must continue to combat hunger in every way possible. The *help* and *hope* your giving brings may never mean more to so many who have lost so much.


Hunger Relief for Elderly Supported by Your Gifts

2020 CARES Act Charitable Giving Incentive

Have you heard?

The CARES Act allows for a one-time, above-the-line deduction for cash contributions* of up to \$300 made to qualifying charities in 2020. All taxpayers are eligible to claim the \$300 deduction, even those who use the standard deduction and do not itemize. The incentive can be claimed on next year's tax forms.

For those who itemize, the law also raises the existing cap on annual donations — from 60 to 100 percent of adjusted gross income for cash contributions*.
