Helping Students Come to School Ready to Learn

Faculty and staff at Nathan Hale Elementary in Whiting, Indiana, work hard every day to create a learning environment in which all students can become proficient readers, writers, and thinkers.

But even the most dedicated teacher with the best educational tools will have a hard time making that happen for children who regularly come to school hungry.

The United Way of Porter County reports that more than one in five NWI children is living in poverty (22%), which puts them at greater risk of experiencing hunger and developmental learning delays.

Kids have a harder time paying attention on an empty stomach. They are likelier to struggle academically and socially. They are absent from class more than their peers.

Your generosity to the Food Bank of Northwest Indiana is helping reduce hunger among students in class and learning from home. The Food Bank's **Backpack On the Go** effort, which feeds school-age kids with healthy, shelf-stable proteins and grains, is reaching hundreds of students in need each month.

Principal Julie Pearson is in her 25th year as a teacher and administrator at Nathan Hale. "We are so grateful to be part of the Backpack on the Go program — and for all the work of the volunteers and donors who make it possible. Many of our

Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in East Chicago bills itself as "The Church that praises God and serves human needs." Celebrating its 100th anniversary in 2022, this vibrant community of worshipers continues to live up to that motto.

The church is one of a dozen sites around East Chicago that hosts a food pantry with the help of the Food Bank of Northwest Indiana. Every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month from 11 am – 1 pm, volunteers and friends of Antioch gather at the church on Alexander Avenue to distribute free food to any neighbor who asks.

Low-income neighbors have been the hardest hit by the pandemic. Across the U.S. in 2020, 80% of COVID-related job losses were among the lowest 25% of wage earners. Cultural minorities and women have suffered the biggest losses. That's a difficult fact to accept given that before the pandemic, one in three East Chicagoans was already living in poverty.

"The outpouring of support in 2020 was absolutely incredible," says Allyson Vaulx, Food Bank Vice President of Development and Communications. "The Food Bank used that money to innovate and expand the ways we're serving. Today, creative new programs that both prevent and reduce hunger are in place. We're doing more than at any time in our history to address the need when and where it happens to keep people self-sufficient.

"We must do more to help thousands of individuals and families who are still fighting their way back. Too many kids and seniors and neighbors living 'on the edge' are falling through the cracks. The Food Bank needs more volunteers and more donors if we're going to realize our vision for a hunger-free Region."
